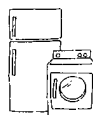
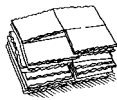


What to Recycle and Where



Paper	Yes	No	Where
TELEPHONE BOOKS	Keep clean and dry.	No plastic bags.	At drop-offs: 4 5 6 17 24
NEWSPAPER Dry newsprint.	Keep clean and dry. Stack in bundles no larger than 12 inches and tie with string.	No magazines, catalogs, tape, unwanted mail, plastic bags, waxed or contaminated/dirty paper.	At curbside in the City of Martinsburg & at drop-off sites: 4 5 6 15 16 17 20 22 24
MIXED PAPER Magazines, catalogs, unwanted mail, computer or office paper.	Keep clean and dry. Place in paper grocery bags.	No plastic bags or string. No dirty, waxed, or food contaminated paper.	At drop-off sites: 4 5 6 16 20 24 Office paper at sites: 17 22
CORRUGATED CARDBOARD Cardboard with ribbed section between layers of cardboard.	Keep clean and dry. Break down and flatten.	No other cardboard. No wax-coated or food contaminated boxes.	At drop-off sites: 4 5 6 16 17 20 22 23 24

Containers	Yes	No	Where
METAL CANS Aluminum, steel (tin) and bi-metal food and beverage containers	Empty and rinse. Flatten to save space. Separate aluminum from steel.	No paint or aerosol cans, pesticide or herbicide spray cans, scrap metal, or food residue.	Cans at curbside in Martinsburg and drop-off sites: 4 5 6 15 20 23 24 Aluminum cans ONLY at sites: 7 10 22
GLASS BOTTLES & JARS Clear, brown and green glass food and beverage containers.	Empty and rinse. Remove and dispose of lids and rings. DO NOT break. Separate by color.	No ceramics, mirrors, crystal, dishes, light bulbs, TV tubes, window and auto glass or cookware.	At curbside in Martinsburg and drop-off sites: 4 5 6 15 23 24 Clear glass ONLY at site: 22 Clear & Brown ONLY at 20
PLASTIC BOTTLES Plastic bottles with a narrow neck and a #1 or #2 in the recycling symbol on the bottom.	Empty and rinse. Remove metal and plastic rings and lids. Crush or flatten. Separate by code.	No plastic bags, yogurt cups, margarine tubs, styrofoam, motor oil or antifreeze containers. No containers coded #3 - 7.	At drop-off sites: 5 6 22 23
PESTICIDE CONTAINERS Empty plastic pesticide bottles.	Must be empty and rinsed.		At drop-off site: 9 Call for information.

Scrap Metal	Yes	No	Where
SCRAP METAL	Aluminum, copper & brass are nonferrous. Iron is ferrous.	No construction & demolition debris, windows, nonmetallic items.	At drop-off sites: 5 7 10 15 20 23
APPLIANCES	Refrigerators, stoves, washers/dryers, air conditioners. Call first to see what is accepted.	Do not damage refrigerant tubing; do not release Freon into the air. Only licensed personnel can remove Freon. A fee may be charged.	At drop-off sites: 7 20 23 Sites 5 6 & 10 accept appliances without Freon. 15 will accept Freon containing appliances ONLY if freon removed & red sticker attached.
ELECTRONICS	Computers, TVs, printers, phones.	Fee charged.	At drop-off site: 11 Fee charged. Call for information.
